

3.0 Pilot Career Pathways Program Information

What Is It?

A Pilot Program that is part of the California Film and Television Tax Credit Program 3.0. That legislation, Senate Bill 878, contained language creating a training and outreach program targeting individuals from underserved communities. Called Career Pathways, this program provides both life skills and professional craft skills training for entry level positions in the entertainment industry in film and television production. Career Pathways is not an internship or apprenticeship program; its goal is to provide the skills and access that leads to careers in the entertainment industry and membership in the below-the-line craft unions.

The Program seeks to attract new and diverse talent, create a pathway which will make it easier for job seekers to pursue a career in the entertainment industry, and ensure California has a trained diverse workforce needed to support the entertainment industry. It is envisioned as a pilot program so that what is learned through its operation can be used to create a statewide program.

The Career Pathways Program makes counselors available to all students as well as access to a mentor who works in the industry. The importance of the mentorship aspect of this program cannot be overstated. In an industry where relationships matter greatly, the mentorship provides critical guidance and support for the students. The mentors are union members thus further strengthening the relationship between the student, the craft unions, and employment opportunities.

In addition to the partners listed below, we anticipate offering a program to train individuals for entry-level positions in production accounting, beginning first quarter of 2022.
